This colorfully enameled elephant figurine bears a mahout, or elephant handler, and a ruler enthroned on a seat called a howdah. In India, elephants were employed as magnificent mounts for royal processions. On such occasions, the animals were adorned with their own regalia. This miniature elephant is draped with a large textile called a jhool, decorated with floral motifs and lined with inlaid diamonds. A smaller textile called a sehri rests atop its forehead.
