

Carved Marble Archway and Water Fountain with Floral Motifs

This lotus-shaped, marble basin is ensconced within a niche over the sunken bathtub in the bathroom of the Mughal Gallery. Lotus blossoms line the underside of the curved arch. The spandrels of the niche are decorated with eight-petalled flowers. Marble carving existed in India since ancient times and took new forms and during the Mughal period, when naturalistic floral designs appeared across all forms of art — from jewelry to architecture. The artistic vocabulary remained a feature in Indian art long after the Mughal empire collapsed in the nineteenth century.
